For each lab, students are required to bring their textbook and to have read the chapter before each lab. It is also recommended that students have the Student Notebook and a graphing calculator or complex math app. This will help them with labs and the complex mathematics for each lab. There will be lab reports due after each lab. Expect 2-3 hours of course work each week. Students should have completed Algebra 1 to take this class.
